## Pharmacy Category Action Items

### Task (Frequency)

Ensure [Basic Readiness](#). Checks are completed quarterly as follows:

- **31 March 2016**
- **30 June 2016**
- **30 September 2016**
- **31 December 2016 (Must be Basic Ready at this point for the following year's promotion boards)**

The annual seasonal flu vaccination is required for the December 31<sup>st</sup> and March 31<sup>st</sup> readiness checks.

The flu vaccination is required once each year before December 31<sup>st</sup>. Always keep evidence/confirmation of the faxes you send to Medical Affairs (MA). Once received, they will update info on the eOPF and Direct Access.

- **Officers should NOT use the old numbers and should ONLY use the following new fax numbers for immunization submissions: (301) 480-0373 or (301) 480-0385.**
- **Use the MA coversheet when faxing immunization documents. The coversheet is available at: [http://dcp.psc.gov/ccmis/PDF\\_docs/Immunization FAX Coversheet.pdf](http://dcp.psc.gov/ccmis/PDF_docs/Immunization_FAX_Coversheet.pdf)**
- **MA enters all medical information in Direct Access, not Readiness and Deployment Operations Group (RedDOG).**

### Chief Professional Officer: RADM Pamela Schweitzer

- Hello and thank you everybody. It's great to see all the students and we're happy you have the opportunity to be here.
- We started off the year and we're already in March. A couple weeks ago I had a chance to go to Oklahoma and see many of the pharmacists out there. It was a great opportunity and honor to see all the ways they are forging their way ahead in pharmacy. I'll be attending the northern tier meeting in the first part of April; I'm looking forward to getting out west and seeing folks out there.
- Tonight starts APHA here in Baltimore. The federal pharmacist forum will be tomorrow and there's a lot of activity going on in the House of Delegates. RADM Church will be helping me with the presentation and we've invited a lot of private sector pharmacists to join us; you'll have a chance to meet with them in the second half of the hour. You will hear about a lot of work that's going on, a lot of it is focused around provider status.
- We're also going to recognize two pharmacists that have done a lot of work for smoking cessation. Robin Corelli and Karen Hudmon helped develop and have been maintaining the curriculum that many pharmacy schools across the country use today.
- I want to encourage everyone to make the symposium this year even if it's only for a couple days. I remember how hard it can be to break away but the networking is very valuable and it's great to meet everybody face-to-face.
- I also want to remind everyone to join our social media on Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter. Follow the Surgeon General's page so you can see what's going on at the SG's office. They've been working really hard to pull us in and keep us in the loop about things they are working on. Also, some of the messages our subject matter expert groups are coming up with have been pushed out through the Surgeon General's social media.
- Strategic planning is still underway at DCCPR. I'll have more information to provide at our next meeting in April and we will also send out updates through the listserv.
- I'll stop there because I want to give LCDR Ben Bishop an opportunity to provide us an update on what happened with the Boy Scout visit.
  - Thank you ma'am. On Tuesday this past week I was privileged to represent the Admiral along with CAPT Mike Long, CDR Chris Jones and CDR Diem Ngo. We were able to meet a delegation of Scouts from around the country that came to the capital to deliver their report to the nation. This included the work they've done on a new patch for medication safety. You could see the Scouts were impressed when the Surgeon General came into the room and he started engaging all of them and he's great with kids. There's a picture album of the event on Twitter; this is the

first time I've been on Twitter and I'm a little worried about that but hopefully it goes well. We were able to share our rich history with the Boy Scouts. Of the 10 pharmacists that have been Boy Scouts, six of them have been Eagle Scouts, which is pretty impressive. It was a great event.

- Thanks LCDR Bishop. Now I want to introduce the ADAPT work group (American Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment). They've been meeting regularly since July and doing a lot of great work, even providing input to the Surgeon General's office. LCDR McClung's here to tell us about the workgroup.

Update from COA Executive Director Jim Currie about this year's symposium:

- I'm delighted to be invited to speak with all of you today. For those of you that are COA members you should've received an email about a **webinar coming up on March 29 at 2:00 PM that will compare our current retirement system for uniformed services and the one that was voted in by Congress in 2016**. It doesn't go into effect until January 1, 2018, but it may have some appeal for junior officers because anyone who joined after 2006 will be eligible for this new retirement system.
- The second thing I want to mention today is our symposium that will take place in Oklahoma City from May 16 - 19th. The symposium will have a lot of great sessions and includes category days (including pharmacy). Among the speakers are the Surgeon General, The Acting Assistant Secretary of Health, and others. We partnered with several Indian tribes in Oklahoma, four of which are sponsors of the symposium, and the Governor of one of the tribes will be our host at the anchor and caduceus dinner. We're expecting to have 1200 to 1300 Public Health Service officers at the symposium. The early bird registration ends April 4th so be sure to visit the COA website before then to get the discounted rate. Look under the foundation section because that's who puts on the symposium each year.
- Other updates since I'm speaking on behalf of COA:
  - We persuaded the Disney Corporation to include PHS officers in their military discount. This works out to be about half the price of a regular admissions ticket.
  - Just this week we heard from Lowe's, the home-improvement people, and they will be including us in their 10% discount. We are reaching out to the Home Depot to see if they'll do the same. We're out there working on issues that impact the Public Health Service; we are part of a bigger group known as the Military Coalition which consists of 31 organizations such as the VFW and MOA.
  - CAPT Sigler: I personally want to thank you for supporting our officers and our mission. I also want to thank you, your wife, and John. As the PAC Chair, I see the schedule that you guys have and know that you're traveling all over the country on our behalf. I'm going to put a plug-in for becoming a COA member. If you're not one you have to ask yourself why not? They are the only group advocating on our behalf. Thank you Colonel.

- We received the official readiness numbers for the check that was done on January 1, 2016. Every single category achieved over 90% readiness for the second quarter in a row. The pharmacy category achieved over 97% readiness, which is fantastic. Thank you again to all the officers for their timely submissions.
- The current readiness (as of 29 FEB 2016) for the upcoming check on April 1 is as follows:
  - The Pharmacy category is currently at approximately 82% readiness, which translates to roughly 200 officers that need to address or submit a missing or expiring readiness requirement before 1 APR.
  - Some updates needed are APFT, five year medical exam, BLS certification, licensure and flu shot.
- A reminder regarding medical waivers: We recommend going to the readiness document ([http://dcp.psc.gov/CCMIS/RedDOG/Forms/Basic\\_Readiness\\_Checklist.pdf](http://dcp.psc.gov/CCMIS/RedDOG/Forms/Basic_Readiness_Checklist.pdf)). There's a lot of great information on this document. The details are in CC circular number 377 (<http://dcp.psc.gov/ccmis/ccis/documents/MC377.pdf>). We also have medical waiver FAQ document on the PharmPAC website ([https://dcp.psc.gov/osg/pharmacy/documents/Medical\\_Waiver\\_FAQ.pdf](https://dcp.psc.gov/osg/pharmacy/documents/Medical_Waiver_FAQ.pdf) ).
  - Typically, a medical issue that is expected to resolve within 12 months will be a time-limited medical waiver. There is a long-term medical waiver for conditions unlikely to improve within five years and these are usually reviewed during your five year physical. The medical waivers are very specific regarding what activities you cannot perform, you will still be required to perform everything else to meet basic readiness requirements.
  - The FAQ document also includes information on how to request pregnancy and postpartum medical waivers.
  - The readiness section will follow up regarding a question concerning email notifications for on-call deployment months.

## Chair-Elect Update: LCDR Rodney Waite
